

SERVICES

BACS has been offering treatment services since 1972. We currently offer the following services in Lewis and Clark, Broadwater and Jefferson Counties:

ASAM Level 1 Outpatient treatment which usually consists of group therapy once a week and individual therapy once every 2 weeks

ASAM Level 2 Outpatient treatment which usually consists of group therapy 4 times a week and individual therapy once a week.

Transitional Living Facility (TLF) is a 7 bed men's halfway house for people who have been through an intensive treatment program and need additional assistance.

Evaluations: Diagnostic impressions are achieved by the use of screenings coupled with a biopsychosocial assessment and the gathering and analysis of data from significant others, law enforcement, schools, employers, and other relevant sources as deemed necessary. All clients are screened for co-occurring conditions

DUI educational and assessment services. DUI or ACT (Assessment Course and Treatment) utilizes the evidence based program called Prime for Life.

Co-occurring therapy All BACS treatment programs are co-occurring capable. This means that our dually licensed staff can identify and often treat coexisting mental illness condi-

tions. Separate co-occurring groups are provided

Women's programming We offer specialized women's groups and programming.

Certified Peer Support We offer support to individuals with a desire to be in recovery having struggles pertaining to lack of coping skills, needing to improve their social support, or substance use.

Cultural and Religious Competency Staff are trained to recognize and compensate for cultural and religious differences.

Locations

Boyd Andrew Community Services Board of Directors is steadfastly dedicated to ensure facilities are professional and modern to better serve their cliental. One recent example of that commitment is the new administrative and outpatient services office building BACS constructed on the walking mall in downtown Helena. It is the first new major construction project in that area in over 17 years.



Currently, Boyd Andrew Community Service's programs are located at their administrative and outpatient facility in Helena and satellite outpatient offices in Boulder, Whitehall and Townsend. Their residential programs include a Pre-Release Center and a transitional living facility serving men located in the Helena area, along with a community-based correctional facility that offers a therapeutic alternative to prison for chemical dependent female offenders located in Boulder, MT.

Funding

Boyd Andrew was first approved by the state of Montana to receive public dollars for the treatment for alcohol and drug addictions in 1977. At this

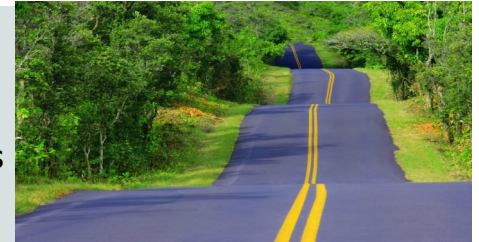
time, BACS receives county earmark dollars, Federal Treatment Block Grant dollars, specialized funding contracts, and are able to bill Medicaid and other third party payers along with receiving private pay and grant funds.

Leadership

Over the past twenty years, Boyd Andrew Community Services has evolved into a statewide leader amongst its peers. The Chief Executive Officer, Amy Tenney is the president of the Montana Addiction Service Providers (MASP), a state-wide provider association. MASP membership consists of 15 Approved Treatment Programs that provide the full continuum of care for substance abuse prevention, intervention and treatment located in all 56 Montana counties. Under MASP leadership, MASP had grown into a well-known and well-respected provider association ensuring all members provide the state of the art in treatment and prevention technology.

Recently BACS formed a separate support organization call Boyd Andrew Management Services (BAMS). This nonprofit corporation was formed because we have devolved expertise in state wide coalition building, administration and contract management. We felt it necessary to separate these activities from the direct client services that BACS has traditionally provided.

Boyd Andrew Community Services is required



to participate in an independent annual contact audit and licensing inspection conducted by Montana Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Quality Control. The Licensing Bureau reviews six areas of performance, those are: administration, personnel, outpatient and intensive outpatient treatment services, residential facilities and ACT/MIP. Over the last five years, BACS has earned an average score of 98 percentile of excellence. These score are representative of those received for the last 20 years and firmly place BACS as one of the best, 'state approved' chemical dependency treatment programs in Montana.

BACS also conducts and annual self-audit and annual peer review audits.

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
